Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do at least one per day)

Weekly Literacy Tasks (Aim to do at least one per day)

Watch Numberblocks Five at: <u>BBC</u> <u>CBeebies or Daily</u> Motion.com

Ten Town - Use your login provided by school to access Ten Town. Watch episodes up to and including Number Four - log in as child.

Write out the digits 0, 1, 2, 3,4, 5 (use pencils, crayons, chalks, shaving foam, flour etc).

Sing Number songs to practice counting, reciting numbers in order, one more, one less using number songs: Five Little Ducks, Five Little Men, Ten Green Bottles.

Play dice games with your child e.g. snakes and ladders. Can your child recognise the numerals/correctly count the number of spots?

March like a toy soldier to the count of 10. Can you march to the count of a larger number?

Draw two of the same animal and practise writing the numeral 2.

Read a variety of books at home. Favourites can be repeated. Hearing the patterns of language in a story will support your child's language development.


Sing Nursery Rhymes and songs together. Add in actions and change the words. Can children think of different rhyming words to add in? Repeat old favourites and learn new rhymes.

Play I-spy with things you can see out of the window e.g. "I spy with my little eye something beginning with t" (teddy).

Oral blending – ask your child to tell you the word you are saying (e.g. adult says 'c-a-t', child says 'cat'). This can be done through a game of I Spy or by having a selection of objects next to you.

Oral segmenting - ask your child to tell you the sounds in a given word (e.g. adult says 'dog', child says 'd-o-g'). This can be done through a game of I Spy or by having a selection of objects next to you.

Introduce letter sound 'f' (useful website: daily motion).



Learn the 'f' song to the tune of Old MacDonald. 'My friends and I went to the beach with my floating fish. It got a hole, the air came out - fffff!.' Action: pretend to hold a blow-up fish toy and then press the air out of it.

Play a phonics game (Phase One or some Phase Two) at www.phonicsplay.co.uk.

With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for one of the phonics sounds taught so far (l i t j u y a c o d s g e). They could use a highlighter to mark these.

Practise name writing (tracing, copying, writing independently, from memory). Can they write their first name? Middle name? Surname?

Practise writing ladder letters (litjuy) and caterpillar

letters (a c o d g e s q f) – by tracing, copying, writing independently or by memory. Use different resources e.g. brush and water, chalk, crayons, shaving gel, paint.


